SEMINAR DESCRIPTION

This two-part professional education seminar is designed to provide human service professionals with an overview of key treatment issues of consumers who have co-occurring disorders of persistent mental illness and chronic substance abuse. A particular focus will be on treatment for consumers who use and/or abuse either prescribed or over-the-counter pain medications.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- To understand key concepts in the relationship between co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse
- 2. To differentiate between substance abuse and substance dependence
- To analyze the similarities and differences between an "abstinence" model and a "harm reduction" model of treatment
- 4. To outline the differences between "wanting" and "needing" pain medication
- To identify commonly used pain medications including potential side-effects and contraindications for use with psychotropic medication
- 6. To outline basic pain management strategies for consumers with substance issues
- 7. To identify signs of opiate mismanagement, abuse and dependence
- 8. To become familiar with treatment options for consumers who abuse opiates
- To describe common family issues associated with having a family member with co-occurring disorders
